It's violence that happens to us because we are women.

The root cause is gender inequality.

We know how to end it.

Men's violence against women and girls is a cause and consequence of gender inequality. It is a violation of human rights, extremely costly to society, and deeply harms a significant number of women and girls. [1]

There were **14,834** sexual crimes recorded in Scotland in the year ending June 2023. [2]

The police recorded **64,807** incidents of domestic abuse in 2021-22. **Four in five** incidents had a female victim-survivor and a male perpetrator. [3]

Men's violence against women and girls causes long term physical and mental health problems, reduced participation in the workforce, substance abuse, and death. [4]

The emotional cost is immeasurable. The estimated financial cost to the Scottish public is **£6.6 billion** per year. [5]

The solution: Primary Prevention

Primary prevention seeks to end men's violence so no one experiences it ever. Effective primary prevention:

- Focuses on structural, cultural, attitudinal, and behavioural change.
- Is a long term, holistic strategy to ensure all women and girls share equal power with men and boys.
- Challenges attitudes that condone violence against women and girls, promote harmful masculinity, enforce rigid gender stereotypes, and emphasise men's dominance. [6]
- Benefits everyone in Scotland.



Effective Primary Prevention

To be effective, primary prevention must be:

- Intersectional. Marginalised women's experiences of gender inequality and men's violence are interconnected with other forms of inequality they experience.
- Developed in collaboration with women's organisations who have expertise in the gendered power dynamics, social norms, structures, and practices that allow violence against women and girls to flourish.
- Community specific and embedded in knowledge of the local context.
- Inclusive of all genders, particularly men and boys.
- Focused on the violence never happening, rather than secondary prevention which intervenes during or after violence.

What you can do

To build a Scotland where violence against women and girls is no longer tolerated, we need your support.

- Ensure investment in expert Primary Prevention organisations.
- Mainstream gender within all Scottish policy.
- Commit to tangible actions on prevention to tackle the root cause and multiple drivers of men's violence within the Equally Safe Refresh Strategy.

This 16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence, we call on the Scottish Government to invest in primary prevention.

We need investment in a holistic, expert-led, long-term prevention strategy that tackles the root cause and multiple drivers of men's violence at all levels of Scottish society.
